Empowering Compassion:

Inviting Women to Make a Difference through Christ Child Society

How many times have we heard or read in the news about child neglect, child abuse, children struggling to exist in today's environment? How many times has this news been about children in our own community? How many times have we talked to our friends about this news and how many times have we heard the words "I wish there was something I could do to help."

Well, we are the "something" that can be done.

Every one of the members of this chapter is working to make a child's life better. Let me give you some numbers:

- Last year we distributed 1,683 layettes and gave over 1200 hours assembling them.
- My Stuff assembled 1,054 bags for 550 hours of assembly work.
- Second Saturday worked directly with 156 moms and 298 children and spent 243 hours of their time to encourage literacy and mental wellbeing in family units.
- School support and literacy works with select schools to provide necessary funding, teaching assistants and supplies to educate children and they donated 240 hours last year.
- Vision screening served 800 children in the past year with 206 hours donated to that cause.

Of course, these are just a small number of the hours that are donated to our projects by each of our members. Not mentioned are all the hours that it took to sew, knit, crochet, and even shop for all the supplies for layettes and My Stuff. There are hours not counted for delivery of the layettes and My Stuff, and now the toddler bag program as well.

Then there are countless hours of paperwork, emails, meetings, the Resale shop, programs, invitations, computer work, newsletters, mailings, and the list just goes on and on. Yet without all of this involvement by our members, there would be a great hole left in the lives of those we serve.

We do make a difference.

We laugh, smile and have a good time while doing all this work. There is a personal satisfaction, a good feeling deep inside, that we receive from helping others. It's good for our souls to "give back."

I would like each one of you to look at your friends, neighbors, daughters, nieces, and other women that you encounter and tell them about the Christ Child Society.

- Bring a friend to one of our project work days
- Invite them to attend a meeting with you and let them experience first hand what we are all about.
- Ask them to share in how good it feels to help others and give back to our community.

It is you that will keep this chapter growing and able to continue serving our community. Remember that we are the "something" that can, and is, being done to make this part of our world a little better for the children in it. We need to spread that word.

CCS Vision Screenings:

Illuminating the Path to Literacy for Young Learners

Vision screening is the cornerstone of any literacy program. If a child has a vision problem and cannot see to read, that child will have a challenging time learning. Eleven Christ Child members are screening this fall at eight area schools.

September 20: St Josaphat School - Screened 23 4 and 5 year olds.

September 24: St. Vincent Pallotti School – Screened 30 4- and 5-year-olds, along with 21 older students identified through parents or teachers.

September 30: St. Agnes School - Screened 72 3-5-year-olds and one other identified student.

October 1: St. Joseph School – Screened 32 3-5-year-olds.

We have more schools scheduled: Blessed Savior School, St. Catherine's School, Northwest Catholic School and Notre Dame School. Our main focus is on the 3-, 4- and 5-year-olds. They are the ones whose eyes change the most and need to be screened yearly.

Other volunteer groups through Prevent Blindness Wisconsin screen the students in grades one through eight unless there is an immediate problem, and we screen them when we are at the school. The teachers and principals are grateful for our work and welcome us into their classrooms.

Growing Gratitude

Our referrals for professional testing are up significantly over the Fall 2023, with some indication that children are glued to their devices and do not play outside like they did before COVID. Young children need to look at objects in the distance to develop the ability to be able to see far. Close-up vision suffers from extended periods of time on electronic devices.

It is rewarding to know that you can change children's lives by screening them and finding a vision problem in less than five minutes. Not only is it rewarding to work with the children, but it is also fun. Our members may not see the immediate impact they are having on children, but they can be satisfied knowing they have made a difference in their lives.

How you can help: We need more volunteers, as many of our members are screening multiple times. To become a certified vision screener is quite easy.

My Stuff Bags: Capturing Smiles and Support to Kids in Need



My Stuff bags are having an outstanding year – and we're not even halfway through! Since the beginning of this fiscal year in June 2024, we have assembled and delivered 497 bags – almost 100 more than this time last year – and averaging 124 bags a month. We started our toddler program in April to include items for sizes 9, 12 and 18 months. We have delivered 36 toddler bags since June.

The need is real

The shelters we serve include Meta House, New Horizon, Cathedral Center, Milwaukee Women's Center, Children's Services and Joy House. Based on our shelter visits last fall, the shelters most in need of the toddler bags are Meta House, New Horizon, Cathedral Center and Milwaukee Women's Center. The moms are extremely grateful for the new items for their children.

We assemble our bags on the first Thursday of every month (except July) at 9 a.m. at the Christ Child Center on 124th St. We are blessed with more than 20 dedicated volunteers every month to sort, clip and assemble the bags. The friendships we've developed make this group so very special. New members are finding they have many common interests with others and know they are making a difference in the children they serve. We are hopeful more provisionals will join us in our monthly assembly.

Reaching out to parishes

We receive so many beautiful in-kind donations, which help us to reach even more children. This year, we sent letters to five parishes that have generously donated to My Stuff Bags for their Advent giving collection in the past, and we are hopeful they will all continue their support of the Christ Child Society. They include St. Sebastian, St. Jude the Apostle, St. Monica, Lumen Christi, St. Mathias and St. Martin of Tours.

One more note: The New Horizon Center has moved to a new location at 2709 North 32nd street. We provide our bags to the children they place in foster care as well as needy children in their daycare center. They continue to ask for donations of full-size containers of shampoo, conditioner, body wash, lotion and soap. You can drop these items off at the resale shop on the second floor. You'll see a sign on the door.

Summer of Service:

Students Transform Communities with Christ Child Society
